- 2. The program aims to improve the capacity for effective and efficient urban road development through Japanese experience such as engineering techniques, measures of traffic congestion relieve, road safety and surrounding environment protection and offered to those who are in charge of urban roads in urban area.
- 3. The applying organizations are expected to nominate those officers who are university graduate or have equivalent educational in civil engineering with at least 5 years of experience in civil engineering. The applicant should have competent command over spoken and written English; must be in good health (both physically and mentally); must not be part of any type of military service and be ages between 25 to 45 years.
- 4. In addition, the following information in respect of the nominated officers may please be mentioned while furnishing the nomination:
 - a) Whether attended any foreign training program in the past? If so, the duration/details thereof;
 - b) Whether cleared from vigilance angle;
 - c) Age;
 - d) Whether working in North East State/J&K;
 - e) A brief in 50-100 words justifying the nomination.
- 5. The course covers the cost of a round-trip air ticket between international airport designated by JICA and Japan; travel insurance from the time of arrival in Japan to departure from Japan; allowances for (accommodation, living expenses, outfit and shipping); expenses for JICA study tours and free medical care for participants who may fall ill after reaching Japan (costs relating to pre-existing illness, pregnancy, or dental treatment are not included).

- 6. It is, therefore, requested that the nomination of suitable candidates may please be forwarded (in two copies) in JICA's prescribed format to this Department duly authenticated by the HOD of the concerned department in accordance with the eligibility criteria.
- 7. The applications should reach this Department through the Administrative Ministry/Department/State Government not later than **17**th **May, 2016**. Nominations received after the prescribed date may not be considered. In the Development Cooperation Charter which was released from the Japanese Cabinet in February 2015, it is clearly pointed out that "In its development cooperation, Japan has maintained the spirit of jointly creating things that suit partner countries while respecting ownership, intentions and intrinsic characteristics of the country concerned based on a field-oriented approach through dialogue and collaboration. It has also maintained the approach of building reciprocal relationships with developing countries in which both sides learn from each other and grow and develop together." We believe that this 'Knowledge Co-Creation Program' will serve as a center of mutual learning process.

I. Concept

Background

The road network have an essential role to build a foundation for improving our daily life and economic activities: road network allows easier access to jobs, healthcare and education as well as it connects goods and services to markets. The road network development in urban area, for example, can help people reduce time in moving from one place to another, increase the safety of the residence and help government provide public service efficiently.

Although the road network development is crucial to improve our urban life, rapid urbanization and motorization in recent years have caused more traffic congestion, traffic accidents and environmental issues. They are attributed by various factors such as rapid population increase, inadequate and poor road infrastructure, urban structure system and rapid increase in number of cars as well as lack of comprehensive plan for city development. Knowledge and technologies based on practical experience are essential to promote further development of urban road network.

This program is designed for the engineering officials responsible for development of urban road network. In this program, participants will obtain practical knowledge on how to cope with the problems through lecturers and site visit in Japan. Knowledge and skills acquired during the program should be incorporated in and reflected in the action plan for promoting further development of urban road network in the participants' countries. Effective implementation of action plans in the participants' countries will be the ultimate goal.

For what?

The aim of this program is to improve the capacity for effective and efficient urban road development through Japanese experience such as engineering techniques, measures of traffic congestion relief, road safety and surrounding environment protection.

For whom?

This program is designed for technical officers in charge of urban roads in urban area.

How?

Participants will obtain new knowledge and ideas of urban road development through lecturers and site visit in Japan. Upon completion of the program, participants will prepare an action plan describing what the participants will do after they go back to home country with the knowledge and ideas acquired in Japan. Participants are required to implement the action plan and report the progress by the end of March 2017.

- **3)** <u>Language</u>: have a competent command of English which is equal to TOEFL iBT 80 or more (This includes active participation in discussions, which requires HIGH competence of English ability. Please attach an official certificate for English ability such as TOEFL, TOEIC etc, if possible.)
- **4)** <u>Health</u>: must be in good health, both physically and mentally, to participate in the program in Japan. Pregnant applicants are not recommended to apply due to the potential risk of health and life issues of mother and fetus.

(2) Recommendable Qualifications

1) Age: Applicants are recommended between 25 and 45 years old.

3. Required Documents for Application:

(1) Application Form:

The Application Form is available at the respective country's JICA office (or the Embassy of Japan.)

(2) Photocopy of passport: to be submitted with the Application Form, if you possess your passport which you will carry when entering Japan for this program. If not, you are requested to submit its photocopy as soon as you

obtain it.

(3) **Nominee's English Score Sheet:** to be submitted with the Application Form. If you have any official documentation of English ability (e.g., TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS), please attach it (or a copy) to the Application Form.

Job Report should be submitted with the Application Form since it is going to be used on screening process as a reference material. As for the detail, please see ANNEX 1.

4. Procedures for Application and Selection:

(1) Submission of the Application Documents:

(After receiving applications, the JICA office (or the Embassy of Japan) will send them to the JICA Center in JAPAN by May 27, 2016)

(2) Selection:

After receiving the documents through proper channels from your government, the JICA office (or the embassy of Japan) will conduct screenings, and then forward the documents to the JICA Center in Japan. Selection will be made by the JICA Center in consultation with concerned organizations in Japan. The applying organization with the best intention to utilize the opportunity of this program will be highly valued in the selection. Qualifications of applicants who belong to the military or other military-related organizations and/or who are enlisted in the military will be examined by the Government of Japan on a case-by-case basis, consistent with the Development Cooperation Charter of Japan, taking into consideration their duties, positions in the organization, and other relevant information in a comprehensive manner.

(3) Notice of Acceptance:

Notification of results will be made by the JICA office (or the Embassy of Japan) **not later than** <u>June 17, 2016</u>.

5. Conditions for Attendance:

- (1) to strictly adhere to the program schedule.
- (2) not to change the program purpose.
- (3) not to extend the period of stay in Japan.
- (4) not to be accompanied by family members during the program.
- (5) to return to home countries at the end of the program in accordance with the travel schedule designated by JICA.
- (6) to refrain from engaging in any political activities, or any form of employment for

- (7) to observe Japanese laws and ordinances. If there is any violation of said laws and ordinances, participants may be required to return part or all of the training expenditure depending on the severity of said violation.

For Your Reference

JICA and Capacity Development

The key concept underpinning JICA operations since its establishment in 1974 has been the conviction that "capacity development" is central to the socioeconomic development of any country, regardless of the specific operational scheme one may be undertaking, i.e. expert assignments, development projects, development study projects, Knowledge Co-Creation programs (until 2015, so called "training"), JOCV programs, etc.

Within this wide range of programs, Knowledge Co-Creation Programs have long occupied an important place in JICA operations. Conducted in Japan, they provide partner countries with opportunities to acquire practical knowledge accumulated in Japanese society. Participants dispatched by partner countries might find useful knowledge and re-create their own knowledge for enhancement of their own capacity or that of the organization and society to which they belong.

About 460 pre-organized programs cover a wide range of professional fields, ranging from education, health, infrastructure, energy, trade and finance, to agriculture, rural development, gender mainstreaming, and environmental protection. A variety of programs are being customized to address the specific needs of different target organizations, such as policy-making organizations, service provision organizations, as well as research and academic institutions. Some programs are organized to target a certain group of countries with similar developmental challenges.

Japanese Development Experience

Japan was the first non-Western country to successfully modernize its society and industrialize its economy. At the core of this process, which started more than 140 years ago, was the "adopt and adapt" concept by which a wide range of appropriate skills and knowledge have been imported from developed countries; these skills and knowledge have been adapted and/or improved using local skills, knowledge and initiatives. They finally became internalized in Japanese society to suit its local needs and conditions.

From engineering technology to production management methods, most of the know-how that has enabled Japan to become what it is today has emanated from this "adoption and adaptation" process, which, of course, has been accompanied by countless failures and errors behind the success stories. We presume that such experiences, both successful and unsuccessful, will be useful to our partners who are trying to address the challenges currently faced by developing countries.

However, it is rather challenging to share with our partners this whole body of Japan's developmental experience. This difficulty has to do, in part, with the challenge of explaining a body of "tacit knowledge," a type of knowledge that cannot fully be expressed in words or numbers. Adding to this difficulty are the social and cultural systems of Japan that vastly differ from those of other Western industrialized countries, and hence still remain unfamiliar to many partner countries. Simply stated, coming to Japan might be one way of overcoming such a cultural gap.

JICA, therefore, would like to invite as many leaders of partner countries as possible to come and visit us, to mingle with the Japanese people, and witness the advantages as well as the disadvantages of Japanese systems, so that integration of their findings might help them reach their developmental objectives.

1. Parts of Application Form to be completed

1) Which part of the form should be submitted?

Official application and Parts A and B including Medical History and Examination must be submitted.

>>Application for Country Focused Training Program including Counterpart Training Program

Part B including Medical History and Examination will be submitted. Official application and Part A need not to be submitted

2) How many parts does the Application Form consist of?

The Application Form consists of three parts as follows;

Official Application

This part is to be confirmed and signed by the head of the relevant department/division of the organization which is applying.

Part A. Information on the Applying Organization

This part is to be confirmed by the head of the relevant department/division of the organization which is applying.

Part B. Information About the Nominee including Medical History and Examination

This part is to be completed by the person who is nominated by the organization applying. The applicants for Group and Region Focused Training Program are required to fill in **every item**. As for the applications for Country Focused Training Program including Counterpart Training Program and some specified International Dialogue Programs, it is required to fill in the designated "**required**" items as is shown on the Form.

Please refer to the General Information to find out which type the training and dialogue program that your organization applies for belongs to.

2. How to complete the Application Form

In completing the application form, please be advised to:

- (a) carefully read the General Information (GI) for which you intend to apply, and confirm if the objectives and contents are relevant to yours,
- (b) be sure to write in the title name of the course/seminar/workshop/project accurately





according to the GI, which you intend to apply,

- (c) use a typewriter/personal computer in completing the form or write in block letters,
- (d) fill in the form in English,
- (e) use ✓or ‰+to fill in the () check boxes,
- (f) attach a picture of the Nominee,
- (g) attach additional page(s) if there is insufficient space on the form,

- submit the original application form with the necessary document(s) to the responsible organization of your government according to the application procedure.
