NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by the provise to artiple 309 of the Constitution, the Preservent hereby makes the following rules for regulating the recruitment of my-servicemen in Central Civil Services and Posts, namely:-

- 1. Short title and commencement:-
- (1) These rules may be called the Ex-servicemen (Re-employment in Central Civil Services and Posts) Rules, 1979.
- (2) They shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of July, 1979.
- 2. Definitions In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
- (a) "Armed Forces of the Union" means the naval, military and air forces of the Union;
- (b) "disable: " servicemen" means ex-servicemen who while serving in the Armed Forces of the Union was disabled in operations against the enemy or in disturbed areas;
- "ex-servicemen" means a person, who has served in any rank (whether as a combation of as non-combatant), in the Armed Forces of the thion, including the Armed Forces of the former Indian States, but excluding the Assam Rifles, "Defence Security Corps, General Reserve Engineering Force, Lok Sahayak Sena and Territorial Army, for a continuous period of not less than six months after attestation, and
 - (i) has been released, otherwise than at his own request or by way and dismissal or discharge on account of misconduct or inefficiency, or has been transferred to the reserve pending such release, or
 - (ii) has to serve for not more than six months for completing the period of service requisite for becoming entitled to be released or transferred to the reserve as aforesaid; or
 - (iii) has been released at his own request, after completing five years service in the Armed Forces of the Union;
- (d) "Para-military forces" means the Border Security Force, Central Reserve Police Force, Indo-Tibetan Boarder Police, Cantral Moustrial Security Force, Secretariat Security Force, Assam Rifles, and Railway Protection Force;
- (e) "reserved vacancies" means vacancies reserved under rule 4. for being filled by ex-servicement

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- 3. Application These rules shall apply to all the Central Civil Services and Posts, Group 10° and Eroup 10° and to the posts of the level of Assistant Commandant in all para-military forces.
- Reservation of vacancies (1) Ten per cent of the vacancies in the posts of the level of Assistant Commandant in all para-military forces, ten per cent of the vacancies in each of the categories of Group 'C' posts and of such posts in each group 'C' Service; and twenty per cent of the vacancies in each of the categories of Group 'D' posts and of such posts in each Group 'D' Service, including permanent vacancies filled initially on a temporary basis and temporary vacancies which are likely to be made permanent or are likely to continue for three months and more, to be filled by direct recruitment in any year shall be reserved for being filled by ex-servicement

Provided the percentage of reservation so specified for ex-servicemen in a category of posts shall be increased or decreased in any one recruitment year to the extent to which the total number of vacancies reserved for ex-servicemen, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (including the carried forward reservations for Schedules Castes and Scheduled Tribes) and for any other categories taken together, falls short or is in excess, as the case may be, of fifty per cent of the vacancies in that category of posts filled in that year:

Provided further that in case of an increase in the reservation for the ex-servicemen under the preceding proviso, the additional vacancies so made available for them shall be utilised first for the appointment of disabled ex-servicemen and if any such vacancies still remain unfilled thereafter the same shall then be made available to other ex-servicemen.

(2) Dut of the vacancies reserved for being filled by ex-servicemen, vacancies shall be reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Cashes and Scheduled Tribes in accordance with such orders as are issued in this behalf by the Central Government from time to time:

Provided that if any ex-servicemen belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe is selected, his selection shall be counted against the overall guota of reservations that kshall be provided for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes in accordance with the orders issued by the Central Government Schedule to time.

- (3) No vacancy reserved for ex-servicemen in a post to be filled otherwise than on the results of an open competitive examination, shall be filled by the appointing authority by any general candidate, until and unless the said outhority, -
- (i) has obtained a 'Non-availability Certificate' from the caployment exchange (where a requisition is placed on an employment exchange);
- (ii) has verified the non-availability of a suitable condidate by reference to the Director General Resettlement and recorded a certificate to that effect; and

(idi) has obtained approval of the Central Sovernment.

5. SPECIAL PROVISION RECARDING AGE LIMIT — For appointment to any vacancy in Central Civil Services Group 'C' and Group 'D', whether reserved or not under these rules, every ex-servicemen who has put in not less than six menths continuous service in the transd Forces of the Union shall be allowed to deduct the period of the resultant age does not exceed the maximum age limit prescribed for the post or service for which he seeks appointment by more than three years, he chall be deemed to satisfy the condition recarding age limit.

- 5. Special provision regarding educational qualifications-
- for appointment to any reserved vacancy in Group 'D'
 poste, every ex-servicemen who has put in not less than
 three years service in the Armod Forces of the Union
 shell be exampt from the minimum educational qualification, if any, prescribed in respect of such posts.
- (2) For appointment to any reserved vacancy in Group 'D' prete, the appointing authority may, at its discretion, relex the minimum educational qualification, where such qualification prescribed in a pass in the Middle School Exemination of any lower examination, in favour of executionan who have put in atleast three years' service in the Armed Forces of the Union and who are otherwise considered fit and suitable for appointment to such posts, in view of their experience and other qualifications;
- For appointment to any reserved vacancy in Group ():

 posts, to be filled partly be direct redultment and

 partly by promotion or transfer, where the minimum qualification

 or technical qualification prescribed for

 appointment by direct requestment postions than that

 prescribed for promotees or transfereds, an expervious and

 shall be doesed to strictly the prescribed odupational

 or technical qualification if he,
 - (i) satisfies the educational or trapical qualification prescribed for direct recruitment to the Post from which promotion or transfer to the post in question is allowed, and
 - (ii) has identical experience of work in a similar discipline and for the same number of years in the Armed Forces of the Union, as precorded for promotess or transferoes.

EXPLANATION: For the purposes of this rule, in computing the period of three years service, there shall be added any period of
service which an ex-servicement has rendered while during in a core
responding p ost or posts in a civil department, or a fublic sertor
undertaking or an autonomous organisation, whether under the Centual
Government or any States Government, or in a resignational bank to
the period of service rendered in the Armed former of the Union.

- 7. Amendment of recruitment rules All rules regulating the recruitment of persons to Group 'C' and Group 'D' posts and services under the Central Government shall be subject to the provisions of these rules and shall be constructed accordingly.
- 8. Interpretation If any question erises as to the interpretation of those rules, the question shall be decided by the Central Government.

Explanatory memorandum to the Ex-sorvinemen (Re-employment in Cantral Diudl Services and Posts) Bules, 1979.

Under the Experviousen (Reservation of Vacancies in the Central Civil Services and Posts, Sless III and Class IV) Rules, 1974, the reservations for ex-servicemen were available in the vacancies filled by direct recruitment in the Dentral Civil Service and Posts, Class III and Class IV. These rules ceased to be in force w.o.f. from the 1st July, 1979. Since the problem of rehabilitation of ex-servicemen is a continuing feature, it has been decided to make available to the ex-servicemen pertain facilities for their rehabilitation in Civil employment on a permunent basis. In formulating the present bules the provisions of the Ex-servicemen (Reservation of Vecencies in the Contral Clvil Services and Posts Class III and Class IV) Rules 1974, and the decisions taken on the recommendations of the Working Group of officers on Resettlement of Exectvicemen with regard to changes in those rules including change in the momencipoure of this rules have been taken into account. This will not adversely officer the rights of any pagegn.
