NOTIFICATION

No. 2/101/72-Estt(D)

7th March, 1974.

Certain age concessions have in the past been sanctioned to a few specified categories of persons for the purpose of appointment under the Government of India. These concessions are still in force until further orders. Details of the categories of persons and age concessions admissible to them as given below, are hereby published for general information:-

(i) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.	(a) All Posts filled by direct recruitment.	5 Years.
	(b) All posts filled by promotion where an upper age limit not exceeding 50 years is prescribed, except posts which have arduous field duties or are meant for operational safety or are in paramilitary organisations.	5 years.
(ii) Retrenched Central Government Employees.	For posts filled otherwise than through UPSC on the basis of competitive tests, i.e. filled through Employment Exchanges.	Period of previous Service under the Govt. of India, plus three years.
(iii) Whole-time Cadet Instructors in N.C.C.	-do-	
a) Who were released from NCC after the expiry of their initial/extended tenure.		Period of service rendered in NCC plus three years.
b) who were released from NCC before the expiry of their initial/extended tenure.		Period of service rendered in NCC, plus three years provided they have served in the NCC for a period of not less than six months prior to their release from NCC.

iv) Ex-General Reserve Engineer Force personnel.

For posts other than through UPSC on basis of competitive tests, i.e. filled through Employment Exchange.

plus three years.

v) Ex-T.B. patients, who were formerly in Govt. service but whose services were terminated on account of affliction with T.B. For all posts subject to the conditions that the UPSC shall be consulted where direct appointment to the post can be made only in consultation with UPSC.

(a) If the posts previously held by them or equivalent posts exist in their own Department.

No age restriction on.

(b) If the posts previously held by them or equivalent posts do not exist in their own Departments.

Period of previous service Plus three years.

vi) Ex-Central Government employees who were discharged on account of affliction with pleurisy.

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Same concessions as in the case of Ex-T.B. patients vide item (v) above.

vii) Educationally qualified Class IV employees, registered with the employment exchanges for the appointment to Class III posts.

For appointment to Class III posts filled through Employment Exchanges.

Period of service rendered under the Govt. of India.

viii) Casual labourers for absorption in regular establishment in Class IV.

For Class IV posts only.

Period spent as Casual labourer. Broken period of service rendered as a casual labourer may also be taken into account for the purpose of age relaxation

appointment in regular establishment, provided the one stretch of such service is for more than six months.

ix) Displaced goldsmiths:

- (a) For employment as craftsmen or semiskilled workers in industrial establishments. For posts in industrial establishments only. Upto 45 years of age.
- (b) For employment in Class III and Class IV posts in non-Industrial establishments/Offices. For class III and IV posts where recruitment is made otherwise than through a competitive examination held by UPSC/ISTM. 5 years.
- (x) Persons of Indian origin who were employed in Govt. service in the East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania and who migrated to India due to constitutional changes. For posts filled otherwise than through UPSC. No age restriction.
- xi) Blind, deaf and orthopedically handicapped persons. For Class III and Class IV posts filled through Employment Exchange. 5 years.
- xii) Repatriates from Burma and Ceylon who have migrated to India on or after 1-1-63 and 1-11-64 respectively. For Class III and IV posts filled through employment exchanges. Upto 45 years.
- xiii) Territorial Army Personnel, who have served on the permanent staff of a Territorial Army Unit or have been embodied for service under T.A. Rule 33 for a continuous period of not less than six months. For posts filled otherwise than through UPSC on the basis of competitive tests i.e. for posts filled through Employment Exchange. Entire period of embodied service including broken periods in the Territorial Army, plus three years.

2. For purposes of the above mentioned age concessions.
- (i) "a retrenched Central Government employees" means a persons who was employed under the Government of India for a continuous period of not less than six months prior to his retrenchment and was discharged as a result of the recommendation of the Economy Unit or due to normal reduction in establishment;
  - (ii) "a whole-time Cadet Instructor in NCC" means a person who was recruited as a whole-time cadet Instructor in NCC on or after 1-1-63.;
  - (iii) "Ex-GREF personnel" means a person who was employed in that Force at least a continuous period of not less than six months and who was released from that Force on completion of his tenure of service.
  - (iv) "an Ex-T.B./Pleurisy patient" means a persons as has been declared non-ineffective and medically fit for Government service by a T.B./pleurisy specialist or a medical authority authorised in this behalf by the Government of India;
  - (v) " A Casual Labourer" means a person not borne on the regular establishment of an office/establishment who has rendered a minimum of two years continuous service as casual labourer in the office/establishment in which he is employed (persons who render at least 240 days of service as casual labour including broken periods of service, during each of the two years referred to above, shall also be deemed as having rendered a minimum of two years continuous service as casual labourer);
  - (vi) a displaced gold-smith means a goldsmith who was thrown out of employment on the introduction of Gold Control Order 1963 and who is in possession of a Certificate from the Revenue Officials not lower in rank than the officers in charge of Tehsils, or Taluks or Revenue Thanas, to the effect that he was actually engaged in working either solely or mainly on gold and either as a self-employed person or a paid employee or a outworker for a period of at least six months preceding the date of issued of Gold Control Rules on 10.1.1963;
  - (vii)
    - (a) " a repatriate from Burma" means a person who can produce either on identity certificate from the Embassy of India, Rangoon, or a certificate from the District Magistrate of the area where he may be residing that he is a bonafide repatriate from Burma;

(b) a "repatriate from Ceylon" means a person who can produce a Certificate from the high Commissioner for India in Ceylon that he is a repatriate from that country.
