Subject:-IAS(Pay) Rules, 1954, Appointment to the senior time scale, Junior Administrative Grade - Manner of computation for eligibility for appointments.

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Sir,

I am directed to invite your reference to this Department's letter No.11010/22/87-AIS(II) dated 31st March, 1987 on the above subject and to say that a question has been raised about the manner in which the Junior Administrative Grade shall be regulated in cases where disciplinary proceedings are contemplated or are pending. It is clarified that a member of the Service, who is under suspension or against whom disciplinary proceedings are contemplated or pending on the date on which he is eligible for JAG, shall not be allowed the Junior Administrative Grade during suspension or when disciplinary proceedings are pending. After the disciplinary proceedings are completed, the case shall be taken up for review. If/ber of the the disciplinary proceedings and it is held that the Service suspension was wholly unjustified, the JAG shall be as comple- admissible retrospectively from the date on which it tely exon- was otherwise due. Arrears of pay and allowances shall erated in also be admissible to him. If however, any penalty is imposed at the end of the disciplinary proceedings, the JAG shall not be allowed during the period of operation of the penalty. In such a case, JAG shall be allowed with effect from the date following the date of expiry of the period of penalty.

2. These instructions shall apply mutatis-mutandis to the members of Indian Police Service and Indian Forest Service.
