- v) Age: He/She must be in the age of thirty (30) to forty-five (45) years.
- vi) Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment: Women are encouraged to apply for the program. JICA is committed to promoting gender equality and women's empowerment, and provides equal opportunities for all applicants regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity and more details of the program may be seen in the brochure.

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# For What?

#### **Background**

In developing countries such as Southeast Asia region and elsewhere, consumer demand for food products is expanding and their needs are diversifying as the incomes of the wealthy and middle class increase in line with economic growth. Although food production in these countries is mainly carried by small-scale farmers, the current situation is not sufficiently conducive to improving the income of small-scale farmers because they do not sufficiently practice horticultural management to meet market needs (product, timing, quantity, and quality).

This KCCP program aims to promote the practice and dissemination of market-oriented facility cultivation in developing countries, and to contribute to the improvement of small-scale farmers' incomes and the development of food value chains (FVCs).

#### **Objectives**

To acquire the knowledge and skills necessary for participants to disseminate market-oriented farming methods and facility cultivation techniques based on the analysis of issues in each region.

#### **Expected outputs**

- To analyze the current situation and challenges related to facility cultivation in the country.
- 2. To acquire the knowledge to collect and analyze information on the market needs (product, timing, quantity, and quality) in the working area.
- 3. To acquire the knowledge and experience to understand the characteristics of facility cultivation and to explain them to stakeholders in the working area.
- 4. To acquire the knowledge to improve/modify existing farming plans based on the results of market needs analysis and utilizing the advantage of the features of facility cultivation.
- 5. To develop an action plan for the introduction of market-oriented facility cultivation in the working area.



includes active participation in discussions and development of Action Plan, which require high competence in English. Please attach an official certificate for English ability such as TOEFL, TOEIC etc., if possible)

Notice of Acceptance

The JICA overseas office (or the Embassy of Japan) will notify the results **not** later than August 9 2024.



## 5. Additional Document(s) to Be Submitted by Accepted Candidates

Accepted candidates are required to make a Inception Report by joining the preprogram and implementing the farmer's interview before coming to Japan.

#### 6. Conditions for Participation

The participants of KCCP are required

- (1) to strictly observe the course schedule,
- (2) not to change the air ticket (and flight class and flight schedule arranged by JICA) and lodging by the participants themselves,
- (3) to understand that leaving Japan during the course period (to return to home country, etc.) is not allowed (except for programs longer than one year),
- (4) not to bring or invite any family members (except for programs longer than one year),
- (5) to carry out such instructions and abide by such conditions as may be stipulated by both the nominating Government and the Japanese Government in respect of the course,
- (6) to observe the rules and regulations of the program implementing partners to provide the program or establishments,
- (7) not to engage in political activities, or any form of employment for profit,
- (8) to discontinue the program, should the participants violate the Japanese laws or JICA's regulations, or the participants commit illegal or immoral conduct, or get critical illness or serious injury and be considered unable to continue the course. The participants shall be responsible for paying any cost for treatment of the said health conditions except for the medical care stipulated in (3) of "3.Expenses", "Administrative Arrangements",
- (9) to return the total amount or a part of the expenditure for the KCCP depending on the severity of such violation, should the participants violate the laws and ordinances,
- (10) not to drive a car or motorbike, regardless of an international driving license possessed,
- (11) to observe the rules and regulations at the place of the participants' accommodation, and
- (12) to refund allowances or other benefits paid by JICA in the case of a change in schedule.

## For Your Reference

#### JICA and Capacity Development

Technical cooperation is people-to-people cooperation that supports partner countries in enhancing their comprehensive capacities to address development challenges by their own efforts. Instead of applying Japanese technology per se to partner countries, JICA's technical cooperation provides solutions that best fit their needs by working with people living there. In the process, consideration is given to factors such as their regional characteristics, historical background, and languages. JICA does not limit its technical cooperation to human resources development; it offers multi-tiered assistance that also involves organizational strengthening, policy formulation, and institution building.

Implementation methods of JICA's technical cooperation can be divided into two approaches. One is overseas cooperation by dispatching experts and volunteers in various development sectors to partner countries; the other is domestic cooperation by inviting participants from developing countries to Japan. The latter method is the Knowledge Co-Creation Program, formerly called Training Program, and it is one of the core programs carried out in Japan. By inviting officials from partner countries and with cooperation from domestic partners, the Knowledge Co-Creation Program provides technical knowledge and practical solutions for development issues in participating countries.

The Knowledge Co-Creation Program (Group & Region Focus) has long occupied an important place in JICA operations. About 400 pre-organized course cover a wide range of professional fields, ranging from education, health, infrastructure, energy, trade and finance, to agriculture, rural development, gender mainstreaming, and environmental protection. A variety of programs is being customized by the different target organizations to address the specific needs, such as policy-making organizations, service provision organizations, as well as research and academic institutions. Some programs are organized to target a certain group of countries with similar developmental challenges.

#### Japanese Development Experience

Japan, as the first non-Western nation to become a developed country, built itself into a country that is free, peaceful, prosperous and democratic while preserving its tradition. Japan will serve as one of the best examples for our partner countries to follow in their own development.

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#### Form5. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

#### 1. General Rules

The participants are requested:

- (1) to strictly observe the course schedule,
- (2) not to change the air ticket (and flight class and flight schedule arranged by JICA) and lodging by the participants themselves,
- (3) to understand that leaving Japan during the course period (to return to home country, etc.) is not allowed (except for programs longer than one year),
- (4) not to bring or invite any family members (except for programs longer than one year),
- (5) to carry out such instructions and abide by such conditions as may be stipulated by both the nominating Government and the Japanese Government in respect of the course,
- (6) to observe the rules and regulations of the program implementing partners to provide the program or establishments,
- (7) not to engage in political activities, or any form of employment for profit,
- (8) to discontinue the program, should the participants violate Japanese laws or JICA's regulations, or the participants commit illegal or immoral conduct, or get critical illness or serious injury and be considered unable to continue the course,
- (9) to return the total amount or a part of the expenditure for the KCCP depending on the severity of such violation, should the participants violate the laws and ordinances,
- (10) not to drive a car or motorbike, regardless of an international driving license possessed,
- (11) to observe the rules and regulations at the place of the participants' accommodation, and
- (12) to refund allowances or other benefits paid by JICA in the case of a change in schedule.

#### 2. Privacy Policy

The participants are requested to understand Privacy Policy of JICA as follows.

#### Scope of Use
