Office Memorandum

Sub:- Grant of adhoc ex-gratia allowance to the Burma Civilian pensioners/family pensioners and widows who are Indian nationals and receiving payment from the Government of Burma.

.....

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Department's O.M. NO. 5/1/85-P&PW dated 17.7.1987 on the above subject and to state that it has since come to the notice of this Department that some of the persons in receipt of Burma pension are also receiving another civil pension from the Government of India. The manner in which such cases should be regulated has been examined in consultation with the Ministry of Finance and it has been decided as follows:

- (i) The civil pension drawn from the Government of India will be regulated in accordance with the provisions of the CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972. In the case of those whose civil pension had commenced prior to 1.1.1986, their civil pension will be consolidated w.e.f. 1.1.1986 in accordance with the provisions contained in this Department's O.M. NO. 2/1/87-PIC(I) dated 16.4.1987. The concept of minimum pension of Rs. 375/- p.m. will be admissible to them on the civil pension drawn from the Government of India.
- (ii) As far as Burma pension is concerned, the provisions of this Department's O.M. dated 17.7.1987 referred to above, will not apply. They will continue to draw Burma pension at the rates admissible to them immediately before 1.6.1987. In other words, they will be eligible for a minimum Burma pension of Rs. 160/- p.m. in terms of this Department's O.M. NO. 5/1/85-PEN dated 13.5.1986.

- (iii) Dearness Relief will be admissible on both the pensions i.e. civil pension as well as Burma Pension in terms of this Department's O.M.NO. 2/5/87-PIC dated 22.4.1987 as amended from time to time. The Dearness Relief on Burma pension will be payable only w.e.f. 1.6.1987.
2. As far as cases of those who are in receipt of Burma pension only and are not in receipt of a civil pension from the Government of India these will continue to be regulated in terms of this Department's O.M. dated 17.7.1987 referred to above. They will also continue to be entitled to appropriate Dearness Relief on Burma pension w.e.f. 1.6.1987 onwards in terms of the said orders dt. 17.7.1987.
3. This Office Memorandum issues with the concurrence of the Ministry of Finance vide their I.D. No. 1(4) E.V/92 dt. 13.2.1992.
4. In so far as persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned, these orders have been issued after consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General of India.
